Befriend a Child Aberdeen is a one-to-one befriending scheme, where children are matched with a volunteer befrienders who takes the child to enjoy fun activities that they might not otherwise have the opportunity to experience due to their family and home circumstances.

“Thanks to the STV Children’s Appeal the children now have the opportunity of taking part in outings and activities that were unavailable to them. This enables the children to go back into school on a Monday morning and talk about what they have done with their befrienders at a weekend. They then feel included, they are accepted and have better interaction with their peers which is a great boost to their self-confidence and self-esteem.”
